Visiting Service

Ko te aroha te mea nuí The greatest thing is love.



Many older people in our community are lonely and isolated as they receive few or no regular visitors. Age Concern Canterbury's Visiting Service helps reduce this loneliness by providing friendship and companionship through a volunteer visitor, enhancing the wellbeing and quality of life of the older person.

Who is the Visiting Service for?

Visiting Service clients must be:

- * willing to be referred,
- * at risk of social isolation due to having no or very few regular visitors,
- * 65 years and over, and
- * able to contribute to a mutually beneficial relationship.

What do Visiting Service visitors do?

Visiting Service visitors provide social support via regular visits of about an hour per week, share interests and activities with clients, and support them, where possible, to make other community contacts.

What Visiting Service visitors do not do?

Visiting Service visitors do not do personal care, housework, handle medications or finances or do regular shopping.

Make a real difference in the life of an older person and become a Visiting Service volunteer

Are you:

- * warm, friendly and do you enjoy a chat?
- * keen to spend time with an older person,
- * able to give about one hour per week on a regular basis,
- * respectful of confidentiality and of other cultures and ways of doing things, and
- * ready to be part of a team and experience ongoing support and training?



Having a visitor works

Research shows that loneliness and social isolation are as bad for health as smoking and can contribute to serious health problems like heart disease and depression. Having a visitor can make a real difference to the health and happiness of an older person.

Becoming a visitor

You need to:

- * attend an interview,
- * pass a police check and reference check,
- * be vaccinated against COVID-19,
- * complete orientation training,
- * be matched with an older person and get to know them,
- * support them to increase their social activity in their own way and at their pace,
- * provide records of your visits, and
- * regularly review with your Co-ordinator how the match is going.

What can you expect when you make a referral to the Visiting Service?

Clients will be assessed and matched with compatible visitors and matches will be regularly reviewed.

The Visiting Service Co-ordinator will liaise with other services or agencies to address client's additional needs if required.
